




It is my sincere hope that this international symposium will inspire both domestic and international experts and serve as a meaningful milestone in advancing occupational therapy and global collaboration.





# The Power of Occupational Therapy in Shaping Health and Well-being

건강과 웰빙을 형성하는 작업치료의 힘

The World Federation of Occupational Therapists (WFOT) is a federation of 111 occupational therapy member organizations and the key international representative of the profession. Like every health profession, occupational therapy is impacted by the changing world and health environment. Occupational therapists need to understand what is impacting on the health and social landscape today and in the future so we can meet the opportunities available to us as a profession.

Recent World Health Organization (WHO) data from various sources shows an increase in the ageing population worldwide, an increase in the prevalence of non-communicable diseases, with at least 16 per cent of the global population experiencing a significant disability and more than 2.5 billion people worldwide in need of one or more assistive products. Alongside this, many countries, including high-income countries, report limitations in their rehabilitation services and shortages in their rehabilitation workforce. All are compounded by climate change, which affects our daily lives, and man-made and natural disasters, which impact and infringe on individuals' and communities' access to and participation in chosen occupations. These are all areas where occupational therapy can and should make significant contributions.

By considering the theme of this important KISOT Symposium 'Empowering Lives: From ER to Community' and reflecting on wide-reaching social, environmental, and systemic factors that impact the health and functioning of individuals, communities, and populations, this keynote presentation will focus on the unique contribution of occupational therapy to health and well-being and how we can influence and shape WHO's Rehabilitation 2023 agenda.

Drawing on personal and professional experiences in government, organizational, and service-level development, Samantha will explore how we can and should remember the core roots of our profession and ensure that the use of occupations is integral in our work.

공공의료는 국가와 지자체가 책임지는 사회적 안전망으로서, 취약계층의 의료 접근성을 보장하고 감염병·재난 상황에 신속히 대응하며 분만·외상·심뇌혈관·소아진료 등 필수과목을 보완하는 역할을 하고 있습니다. 또한 예방과 만성질환 관리, 돌봄을 연계하고 지역 간 의료격차를 완화하며, 민관 협력을 통해 연속적인 치료체계를 유지하는 기능을 담당하고 있습니다. 경기도의료원은 이러한 역할을 실현하기 위해 돌봄의료센터, 감염병 대응체계, 수도권 감염병전문병원 구축, 간호간병통합서비스, 분만·재활 특화, 이동진료 및 장애인 구강진료 지원사업 등을 추진하고 있습니다.

Public healthcare serves as a social safety net for which the national and local governments bear responsibility. It ensures medical accessibility for vulnerable populations, provides rapid responses to infectious diseases and disasters, and supplements essential medical services such as obstetrics, trauma care, cardiovascular and cerebrovascular treatment, and pediatric medicine.

Furthermore, public healthcare connects prevention, chronic disease management, and long-term care, helps reduce regional disparities in medical services, and maintains a continuum of care through public-private cooperation.

To fulfill these roles, the Gyeonggi Provincial Medical Center is advancing a range of initiatives, including the establishment of a Comprehensive Care Center, infectious disease response systems, and a Metropolitan Infectious Disease Hospital; expanding integrated nursing care services; and promoting specialized programs in obstetrics and rehabilitation, as well as mobile clinics and dental care support for persons with disabilities.

## Occupational Therapy Futures: Thinking with Deleuze on 'Difference' and 'Becoming'

들뢰즈의 차이와 되기 관점에서 본 작업치료 미래

AI 시대에도 작업치료는 생존할 것이지만, 단순한 적응만으로는 충분하지 않다. 미래는 생성형 AI를 넘어 행동형·물리적 AI가 도래하는 시대, 작업치료는 새로운 패러다임을 모색해야 한다. 따라서 21세기 철학사에서 위대한 들뢰즈가 강조한 "되기(becoming)"를 이해하는 것이 필요하다. 되기는 고정된 완성이 아닌 끊임없이 반복되는 과정이다. 작업치료에서 만나는 존재는 동일성과 본질로 회귀하는 것이 아니라 차이와 생성 속에서 '되기' 과정으로 이해해야 한다. 작업치료사는 사람을 고정된 기능적 존재로 보지 않고, 환경과의 상호작용 속에서 끊임없이 변화하고 의미를 만들어가는 가능성의 장으로 이해한다. 바둑판 위의 이세돌의 78수는 기존 질서를 해체하고 "기관 없는 신체(Body without Organs)"의 장을 열었던 것이다. 작업치료는 재활분야에서 유일하게 이를 실천할 수 있는 전문가이다.

Occupational therapy will continue to exist in the age of AI, yet mere adaptation will not be enough,

The future is moving beyond generative AI toward an era of behavioral and embodied AI, and occupational therapy must seek a new paradigm in response.

To this end, it is essential to understand what Gilles Deleuze, one of the great philosophers of the 21st century, emphasized as "becoming." Becoming is not a fixed state of completion but an ongoing, recursive process of transformation.

The beings we encounter in occupational therapy are not to be understood through identity or essence, but through difference and continual becoming. Occupational therapists do not perceive individuals as static, functional entities; rather, they understand them as fields of potential, constantly changing and generating meaning through interaction with their environment.

Just as Lee Sedol's 78th move in Go dismantled the existing order and opened a "Body without Organs", occupational therapy stands as the only profession within rehabilitation capable of realizing such a transformative praxis.

## Empowering lives through OT

A distinctive feature of occupational therapy is that the time available to work with clients is often limited due to constraints within medical, health, and social welfare systems. Therefore, occupational therapy must aim to provide support that ensures sustainability—so that even when the therapist is no longer present, clients can continue to live authentically as themselves.

To achieve this, it is essential to foster empowerment, enabling clients to recognize their own abilities and to problem–solve through trial and error, even in challenging situations. In the field of pediatrics in particular, the therapeutic period is limited, making it crucial to support children in continuing to grow and live true to themselves beyond therapy. Moreover, not only the children but also their families—who live most closely with them—should be considered clients to be empowered.

This lecture will introduce the theoretical background and scientific evidence underpinning client empowerment. By learning from both academic perspectives with a real story of clients, this session will provide an opportunity to reconsider what occupational therapy can truly offer and to appreciate its unique value.

## **Empowering lives of Stroke Survivors**

Stroke remains the leading cause of long-term disability in the United States (US), reflecting the reality that the majority of stroke survivors experience chronic symptoms. The medical and rehabilitation services in the US support a biomedical model with the goal of optimizing neuroplasticity and the remediation of impairments in the acute and subacute phase of recovery. However, there is a stark gap in rehabilitation services to adequately address an individual's transition back into the community and the management of chronic symptoms. One approach to meet the changing needs of individuals living in the community with chronic stroke is the adoption and integration of the chronic care model framework into rehabilitation service delivery. From the perspective of the chronic care model, key goals of therapy would be to optimize patient autonomy and self-management skills. By shifting decision making from the therapist to the patient and prioritizing patient driven goals and lived experience, we can start to facilitate an individual's ability to transition back into the community.

A general overview of the US healthcare system will be presented and current occupational therapy services delivered within each rehabilitation setting will be discussed. A review of the chronic care model framework will be introduced and followed by examples of self-directed and self-management interventions that reflect key components of the chronic care model.

# Empowering lives within the Integrated Care: ageing and disability

Korea is reforming its rehabilitation care system to navigate a super-aged society and the escalating prevalence of disability intertwined with aging. This paradigm shift adopts a "life-course perspective" and a comprehensive, integrated approach to empower the lives of older people with disability and to manage and prevent late effects for people with disabilities. The restructured system spans acute, post-acute, and chronic phases, incorporating post-acute rehabilitation hospitals with intensive rehabilitation services and home-visit rehabilitation. Central to the new model are the Nationwide Regional Health & Medical Centers for People with Disabilities, which serve a critical role in linking community healthcare and social care systems. These centers provide multidisciplinary services, support Primary Care Physicians for People with Disabilities for comprehensive assessment and home-based care, and facilitate telehealth and telerehabilitation for community-dwelling individuals. The overall goal is to achieve a more comprehensive and integrated model to address the expanding and varying demands for rehabilitation services.

This review discusses ongoing reform of the rehabilitation care delivery system to address the growing demand for care services in a super-aged society and to empower people with disabilities by implementing comprehensive and integrated models that adopt a "life-course perspective."

## Building health prevention network

The development of health prevention networks in Taiwan has been closely tied to the real stories of individuals empowered through occupational therapy (OT).

#### 1. Challenges of healthy aging

Taiwan faces not only the burden of chronic diseases but also lifestyle-related risks, aging, and social isolation. These challenges demand proactive, prevention-oriented strategies.

#### 2. Attempts since 2017

Since the launch of national initiatives- Programs to Prevent or Delay Disability, occupational therapists have been at the forefront—engaging with local community centers, schools, municipal and national government to create programs as well as system that support the ageing population.

#### 3. Role of occupational therapists

Occupational therapists play a vital role in Taiwan's prevention network. Their contributions extend from developing programs to prevent or delay disability to hosting activities in community centers that promote healthy aging and social participation. They also serve as consultants for community organizations and local governments, ensuring that interventions are relevant and sustainable. At the broader level, occupational therapists act as policy advisors for the central government, shaping strategies that integrate prevention, rehabilitation, and reablement into national health systems.

#### 4. Unsolved issues.

Several challenges remain unresolved in building a sustainable prevention network. These include the unclear positioning of health promotion interventions, the lack of a comprehensive system supporting outcomes evaluation, the limited development of service models beyond group-based training, and the need for sustainable models of community organization.

#### 5. Road ahead.

The Long–Term Care 3.0 national policy, set to officially launch in 2026, places strong emphasis on "programs to prevent or delay disability" and Reablement. Both of these pillars align directly with the expertise of occupational therapists, positioning OT as a key profession in implementing and advancing the policy's vision for healthy aging and community–based care. Looking forward, Taiwan must strengthen its prevention networks by integrating OT expertise into public health policies, expanding community–based programs, and fostering global exchange.



## Community support in the mental health

Enhancing Community Support in Mental Health Through Modular Occupational Therapy

This presentation introduces an innovative Occupational Therapy Modular Charting System specifically designed to enhance community support for individuals with mental health conditions. Integrating global evidence with Taiwanese regulatory frameworks, this system offers a structured yet person–centered approach to addressing diverse needs beyond traditional clinical settings.

The core of our approach lies in nine key modules, each focusing on a critical life domain where occupational therapists play a pivotal role. The Housing module, for instance, emphasizes OT-led supportive housing, evidenced by RCTs, to significantly improve daily function, community participation, and quality of life for individuals with serious mental illness. The Placement module focuses on skill development for successful transitions from institutional care to community living, particularly for vulnerable populations like children in out-of-home care, using trauma-informed perspectives. Our Employment module champions the Individual Placement and Support (IPS) model, recognizing work as central to recovery and integrating job redesign strategies validated by local research.

Beyond these, modules for Education, Aged Care, Access to Medical Care, Social Participation, and Independent Living are equally vital. They are grounded in evidence ranging from leisure education for social connection to "Self-Reliance Support" models for healthy aging and ADL/IADL skill enhancement. Crucially, the system incorporates Taiwanese research and policy, such as "cultural care" for indigenous populations and the "coaching approach" in family collaboration.

This modular system enables occupational therapists to act as "systemic bridges" (Module 9), developing community-based programs and advocating for clients. By systematizing evidence-based, person-centered interventions across these life domains, we empower individuals with mental health conditions to thrive in their communities, fostering autonomy, meaningful engagement, and overall well-being.

## Functional Cognition Intervention in Medical Setting

의료환경에서 기능인지 중재

본 발표는 국내 의료 환경에서 작업치료사가 수행하는 기능인지중재(Functional Cognition Intervention)의 실제 적용 사례를 중심으로, 평가-목표설정-중재 실행의 흐름을 소개한다. Dynamic Interactional Model을 기반으로 인지기능과 자기인식, 환경요인을 통합적으로 고려하고, 수행 기반 평가와 작업중심 목표를 바탕으로 적응, 단계화, 전략훈련 등 활동 기반 중재 전략을 적용하였다. 사례를 통해 기능 회복뿐 아니라 실생활 참여 향상에 기여하는 기능인지중재의 임상적 가치와 실천 가능성을 조명하고자 한다.

This presentation introduces the clinical application of Functional Cognition Intervention implemented by occupational therapists in the Korean healthcare context, focusing on the practical process of assessment-goal setting-intervention.

Based on the Dynamic Interactional Model, the approach comprehensively considers cognitive function, self-awareness, and environmental factors, while applying activity-based intervention strategies such as adaptation, task grading, and strategy training, grounded in performance-based assessments and occupation-centered goals.

Through a case example, this presentation highlights the clinical value and practical feasibility of functional cognition intervention—not only in restoring function, but also in enhancing participation in daily life.

# Enduring Together in Occupation – Practices and Sustainable Challenges of Stay Strong Together

'Stay Strong Together' 캠프를 통한 함께 견디기 및 상호성장

Stay Strong Together (SST) was initiated in 2021 to address the care gaps and social isolation experienced by youth with developmental disabilities and their families during the COVID–19 pandemic. Initially guided by the slogan "enduring together," SST aimed to provide safe and meaningful occupational participation for youth while offering families opportunities for rest and social connection. From 2021 to 2025, a total of 24 camps were held, involving approximately 315 families and 320 youth with developmental disabilities, supported by occupational therapists and students, approximately 1.7 times the number of youth participants.

This presentation discusses strategies that have enabled SST to evolve from a temporary response into a sustainable model of occupational therapy practice. First, the Participation & Function Check was developed to move beyond program—driven activities toward individualized, occupation—centered support. Based on caregiver reports, this profiling tool allowed detailed identification of personal and physical characteristics, leading to tailored occupational challenges. Second, the Performance & Function Observation framework was applied during camps, enabling professional supervisors to analyze real—time performance levels, address discrepancies between reported and observed outcomes, and ensure stable participation. Third, systematic video documentation and dissemination of outcomes enhanced research value and increased societal visibility. Finally, SST functioned as a practice—based educational platform, supported by the formation of a Headquarters (HQ) team. The HQ team assumed responsibility for supervision and program leadership, ensuring professional quality while creating a structure for succession. By cultivating the growth of participating occupational therapists and students, the HQ system provided a foundation for sustainability and professional development through future research and education.

The experiences of SST demonstrate how occupational therapy provides the invisible force that sustains "ordinary everyday life," while restoring participation and occupational justice for individuals facing occupational deprivation. This presentation argues that initiatives like SST highlight the need for occupational therapists' social contributions to combine volunteer spirit with professional responsibility, ensuring sustainability and continued impact.
